ABOUT THE TOURNAMENT

The trophy was last awarded in 1995 to the Richmond Roadrunners as a Western Canadian Championship event for Junior B Lacrosse.

With the help of <u>Frazer MacDonald</u>, longtime supporter and advocate for Junior B lacrosse in British Columbia, this trophy is once again being used to celebrate Junior B2 lacrosse in Western Canada as an invitational event. The "MacDonald Cup" tournament will remain an invitational until it once again can be a Western Championship event featuring the top teams in Junior B2 from BC, Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba. Dave Wallace (@wallaceworksfdc) has redesigned the trophy with some outstanding woodwork additions.

City of Brooks

The City of Brooks is home to over 15,000 residents and provides services to an additional 8,000 people living in the surrounding County of Newell. Located on the Trans-Canada Highway, Brooks is the largest urban centre and service provider in the County of Newell.

Located two hours southeast of Calgary and one hour west of Medicine Hat, Brooks is a sport loving city in the heart of south-eastern Alberta.

The City of Brooks is located on Treaty 7 lands.

We honour and respect the traditional peoples who call this region home Siksika First Nation and the Metis peoples of Region 3 of the Metis Nation of Alberta.



EVENT VENUE

Centennial Regional Arena

Overview

The Centennial Regional Area (CRA) has formed a significant element of the social fabric of the region since its opening in January 2010. The 87,000 square foot facility is the cornerstone of the community, hosting many provincial and national events.

The arena is equipped with full bowl seating for 1,704 people, with 1,555 of the seats being 22" wide and 149 seats at 19.69". There are also private suites and standing room for an additional 796. There are four large private suites (for up to 18 people each) and two small suites (8 people each.) There are 17 wheelchair seating stalls provided along the top row.

The flasher boards are 42" high with a piece of 6' tempered glass and athletic netting at each end. The netting system is fully retractable to allow for unobstructed viewing of other non-sporting events.

The top-quality sound system was designed along a comprehensive acoustic study. As a result, the concourse walls along with the private suites are treated with acoustic treatment. This system has multiple locations for hook-ups of microphones as well as a wireless system.

The ice plant equipment is state of the art. More importantly for our intentions, facility temperatures are maintained at a comfortable level pertinent to the event.

The NW and SW corners of the concourse can be utilized for pipe and drape areas for volunteers, VIP, and media services.

Dressing Room Plan

The configuration of the CRA will allow for a straightforward and simple approach to dressing room assignments with no space wasted. Every team will have shower and washroom facilities with benches, hooks, and proper flooring.

TICKET PRICES

Between the City of Brooks and the County of Newell, there's a population of more than 20,000 residents. Driving distance to large centres like Calgary (2 hours), Medicine Hat (1 hours) and Lethbridge (1.5 hours) is fairly reasonable and for an event like the MacDonald Cup, it's likely to draw support and fans to attend from these areas.

Under facility usage terms, the host has the right to sell tickets to all 1,704 seats, and 500 standing room, for each game. Suites are leased on a yearly basis, with the exception of one large suite which the Bandits organization controls. Yearly suite holders will be offered first rights to rent their suites for the event.

Ticket sales will begin with full tournament packages. Once that deadline has passed, those packages will be opened to the general public and sold online throughout the 2024 regular season. As the event draws closer, single game tickets will be made available.

Please complete all information and forward requested documents below and deposit as noted. The MacDonald Cup will be played August 7-11th at the Centennial Regional Arena in Brooks, Alberta hosted by the Chaos Junior Lacrosse Club. There will be 8 teams with two pools of 4, with all teams getting 5 games. You will play one game per day, during one of the daily game slots 10am, 1pm, 4pm, & 7pm. Teams being considered to attend are from British Columbia, Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba.

The cost will be \$2,500 per team, with a required deposit of \$500 at time of application and includes:

- 5 games guaranteed (for top 6 teams)
- New arena with video scoreboard, lots of free parking
- Free live streaming with play-by-play
- Website with live stats
- Game MVP and tournament awards
- Event merchandise available
- Designated dressing room in arena (under negotiations)
- On-site photographer for team and individual photos

The long term goal of this event is to become a Western Canadian Championship event with hosting locations changing each year. This will give entry level junior players the opportunity to play in a Championship event to align with National junior events like the Founders and Minto Cups. Deadline for applications is May 27, 2024.
