

TO: All Alberta Players Born in 2008

WELCOME to Major Lacrosse!

Major Lacrosse is for those players aging out of Minor Lacrosse who still wish to play competitive lacrosse. The growth in Major Lacrosse and sustainability of Major Lacrosse teams is totally dependent on the number of players coming up from Minor Lacrosse.

Please plan to attend one of the RMLL Junior Lacrosse Information Sessions being held in Edmonton and Calgary. The Session in Edmonton will be held on Friday, January 3, 2025, at the Central Lions Senior Rec. Centre – Large Auditorium, 11113-113 Street, and will start at 7:00 p.m. The Session in Calgary will be held on Friday, January 10, 2025, at the Acadia Recreation Centre - Rose Hall, 240 90 Ave SE, and will start at 7:00 p.m. Members of the RMLL Executive and Junior Team Representatives will attend both Sessions to provide information on our Junior Programs.

Governance

Governance rules in Major Lacrosse differ from Minor Lacrosse and rules may change from Division to Division depending on if a Division has their own Operating Policy.

Major Lacrosse encompasses all players who turn 17 as of December 31, 2025 (birth year 2008). We have two age groups: Junior and Senior. Junior Lacrosse is for players between 17 and 21 years old as of December 31, 2025, and Senior Lacrosse is for players who are over the age of 21, who still wish to play competitive lacrosse. The governing body for Alberta Major Lacrosse is the Rocky Mountain Lacrosse League (RMLL).

There are 6 Divisions and 60 teams in the RMLL:

Alberta Series Lacrosse (Senior B) – 5 teams

Senior C - 11 teams

Junior A – 4 teams (includes 1 team from Saskatoon)

Junior B Tier I – 15 teams (includes 1 team from Saskatoon, 1 from Regina and 1 from Winnipeg)

Junior B Tier II – 16 teams

Alberta Sr. Major Female – 2 teams

Alberta Jr. Major Female – 7 teams

Each RMLL Division has a Commissioner who is appointed annually by the Franchises in a Division. The Commissioner is a Member of the RMLL Executive, represents their Franchises on the Executive and is responsible for administering their Division. All RMLL Divisions must meet the same standards and are treated equally. All games are 3 twenty-minute stop time periods, with 10-minute intermissions and minimum 30-minute warmup.

Some significant differences between Minor and Junior Lacrosse are:

- all games are 3 twenty-minute stop time periods, with 10-minute intermissions with a minimum 30-minute warmup.
- Season is usually longer, depending upon how deep you go in the playoffs.
- Nets are bigger (4'X4'6" instead of 4'X4').
- Provincial travel (and in some Divisions, inter-provincial travel).
- 3-Person-Mechanic (Referees) for Jr.A and when available Sr. B, Tier I, Tier II and Major Female.
- RMLL modified rules of play making for a faster game.
- Home and away uniforms.
- New teams to play.
- Five-year age category.
- Different tactics are introduced and developed.

Junior Tiers

Excluding the Alberta Major Female Division, we have three (3) tiers of Junior Lacrosse: Junior B Tier II, Junior B Tier I and Junior A. The main difference between each tier is the increased level of play. For example: as players develop their skills, the game becomes faster, harder hitting and with each level game strategy becomes even more of an integral part of a team's success.

A player's time commitment also increases with each level as a Junior B Tier II player is most likely on the floor 2 to 3 times a week whereas a Junior A player is on the floor 4 to 5 times a week.

The Junior B Tier II Franchises are the entry level teams for most first-year Juniors. In 2024, of the 213 first year Juniors who played in the RMLL, 4 played on a Junior A Franchise, 78 played on a Junior B Tier I Franchise and 131 played on a Tier II Franchise. During the five-year span of Junior Lacrosse, players are encouraged to move up through the Junior Tiers as their skill level develops. The two Tiers of Junior B are responsible for player development and provide players with the tools to further their playing skills.

Boundaries

Boundaries for the initial registration of a first-year Junior is with your Minor Club if your Club offers a Tier II Franchise. If your Minor Club does not offer a Tier II Franchise, then you may be a Tier II Free Agent and may register with any Tier II Franchise.

If a player, in the last year of U17, was given a one-year release from their Minor Club to play in another Minor Club, then the player's rights are held by the Club giving the release. If a player, in the last year of U17, was given a permanent release from their Minor Club to play in another Minor Club, then the player's rights are held by the last Club they played for.

Registration

Currently the 2025 Box Season Registration for RMLL players is **not open** due to a software change that is still being developed.

We do not yet have a date for when we can open registration for the 2025 Box Season but hopefully, we will be able to open early in the new year.

A communication will be sent out once the 2025 Box Season registration is open.

Junior Entry Drafts

To assist with keeping the competitiveness of Franchises in a Division consistent, the Junior A Division and the Junior B Tier I Division hold annual Drafts. Each Division has a Graduating U17 Player Draft held annually before mid-February.

<u>Graduating U17 Player Draft</u> – At the end of each playing season, the ALA provides the RMLL with a list of all the U17 players graduating from the season just completed. This list is the Graduating U17 Player List. All male players on this list are eligible for the Junior A and Tier I Graduating U17 Drafts.

Each of the Alberta Junior A Franchises draft ten (10) players from this list and each of the Alberta Junior B Tier I Franchises may draft up to twenty (20) from the list. For complete details re the Junior A and Junior B Tier I Graduating U17 Player Drafts, please refer to the section "Junior A and Junior B Tier I Draft Detail" found at the end of this document.

Players drafted by both a Jr. A Franchise and Jr. B Tier I Franchise must attend the tryouts of both the Jr. A Franchise and the Jr. B Tier I Franchise they have been drafted to.

Rosters

In Major, each Franchise can have a maximum roster of 25 players. The exception to this is Alberta Series Lacrosse (Sr. B), and Alberta Major Female who may have a maximum roster of 30 and the Senior Major Female Franchise and Senior C who may have a maximum roster of 40 players. However, for all Franchises in all Divisions, you can only dress 20 players for each game. i.e. max 18 runners and 2 goalies.

Travel

All Franchises in Major lacrosse, regardless of the Division they are in, must travel. It's up to the policies of the individual Franchises whether buses are used for travel games.

Schedules

We try to have all Division schedules posted on the RMLL website by mid March. This gives players a six-week notice period in case they must arrange/re-arrange work schedules, etc. Depending on arena availability, we try to schedule weekday games against two teams in the same local area, leaving Saturday and Sunday for travel games. i.e. team travels or team plays a traveling team.

Player Development

Call-ups are an important piece of player development. The number of times a player can be a call-up during a season is unlimited. To encourage call-ups, each Tier has a set night for weekday games. Tier II Monday and Wednesday, Tier I Tuesday and/or Thursday and Junior A Wednesday. This allows a Tier II player to be a call-up for a Tier I team on a Tuesday and Thursday and for a Tier I player to be a call-up for a Junior A team on a Wednesday.

Junior A and Junior B Tier I Draft Detail & 2025 Drafts

Junior A Graduating U17 Player Draft

2025 Draft Eligible: All U17 Players born in 2008 and on the ALA Graduating U17 Player List.

Up until the draft date, all Graduating U17 Players on the Graduating U17 Player List from CALL, CDLA and SALA Minor Lacrosse Clubs may attend any/all open floor sessions of the Jr. A Mounties and/or Jr. A Raiders.

Junior A Franchise Protected List: Drafted players are automatically added to the Junior A Franchise's Protected List and the Junior A Franchise holds the player's Junior A playing rights for

all five (5) years of the player's Junior eligibility until the player is released or traded. A non-drafted player can be added to a Jr. A Franchise's Protected List, if the player gives written permission, agreeing to be added.

Jr. A Free Agent: A player not on a Junior A Protected List is a Jr. A Free Agent. Jr. A Free Agents who reside north of the CALL boundary may try out for the Jr. A Miners. Jr. A Free Agents who reside in CALL, CDLA and SALA areas may try out for the Jr. A Mounties and/or the Jr. A Raiders. (A drafted/protected player can only attend the tryouts of the Jr. A team which drafted/protected them).

The Calgary Junior A Mountaineers and the Calgary Junior A Raiders each draft ten Graduating U17 Players from the CALL, CDLA and SALA Minor Lacrosse Clubs.

The **Edmonton Junior A Miners** draft ten Graduating U17 Players from the GELC and Wheatland Minor Lacrosse Clubs as well as from the Grande Prairie Lacrosse Association.

The **Saskatchewan SWAT** draft ten players from the Province of Saskatchewan.

Junior B Tier I ENTRY Draft

Up until the draft dates, all Graduating U17 Players on the Graduating U17 Player List may attend any Junior B Tier I floor time.

Up until the draft dates, all Tier II players not currently listed on a Junior B Tier I Franchise's Protected List may attend any Junior B Tier I floor time.

The drafts help to keep the competitiveness of Franchises in a local area consistent.

The drafts must be held each year prior to mid-February. The Junior B Tier I drafts will take place after the Junior A Drafts.

Junior B Tier I Franchise Protected List: Drafted players are automatically added to the Junior B Tier I Franchise's Protected List. A player can remain on a Jr. B Tier I team 's Protected List for all five (5) years of their Junior eligibility unless released, traded, or not registered to the team's roster for two (2) consecutive playing seasons. An exception to the two consecutive playing seasons, is a Jr. B Tier I Drafted player on a Junior A roster. This player can remain on the Tier I Protected List for all five (5) years of their Junior eligibility unless released or traded. A non-drafted player can be added to a Junior B Tier I Franchise's Protected List, if the player gives written permission, agreeing to be added.

Junior B Tier I Free Agents

All Graduating U17 Players on the Graduating U17 Player List for the Season who are not drafted, will become Junior B Tier I Free Agents.

All Tier II players who are not on a team's Protected List are Junior B Tier I Free Agents.

Junior B Tier I Central Graduating U17 Player Draft
