9. New Business

a. Game Day Operations

- i. Approving a Call Up is a timely process. Each Commissioner involved is required to complete their step. You cannot ask other Commissioners to do that for you. No call up request has ever been missed being completed.
- ii. It is never acceptable to enter the opposing teams change room during the game uninvited. *This falls unto the Referees as per Rule 14 Situation 1. What procedure is used for incidents occurring before or after a game? Any incidents or altercations of note, occurring during a warmup or after a game shall be reported on a special incident report. The referees' jurisdiction is 15 minutes prior to game time and shall continue until the teams have entered the dressing rooms after the game and all penalties shall be assessed as required. Any incident involving abuse of Referees and Off-floor Officials at any time shall be documented and reported to the appropriate governing body.*
- iii. During a game, should conversation be required, it is between only the Coaches with level heads only in a neutral location.
- iv. Player Coach is a qualified Coach who also plays. Not just a random player written down as a Coach. They must be entered into the RMLL System Management system as a Coach. See attachment for Coaching Level Requirements. Please note that there is another course Coaches are required to take: "Safe Sport Module".
- v. Errors on the Game Sheet – Please make sure your box people feel empowered to call the Referee back to the box to ask questions. The box staff should work in teams of two.
- vi. Behavior of Players in the Penalty Box: This is a very small space. Both parties need to treat each other with respect and not antagonize one another. If there is an issue, please empower your Box Volunteers to catch a referees' attention by hitting the buzzer. They do NOT go on the floor.
- vii. REMINDER: Running Time When Short of Players. It is a courtesy decided between two teams on an "as needed" basis. Game sheet writers need to be extra aware of the times of penalties and goals when the game is in running time.

- c. Officials
 - i. Game fee changes – \$90/Referee/game. There has been no rate change for at least 10 years. All Divisions at same rate.
 - ii. 2-man vs 3-man for 2026 Discussion – while some interest has been expressed. There simply are not enough referees to accomplish this currently.
 - iii. Referees are working a recruitment program. They have tasked a couple retiring Referees to call previous referees to see if they would be willing to take on a few games.
 - iv. The ALRA can “fast track” ex-RMLL players. If you know of one who is reffing, please let them know.
 - v. There are simply too many minor LGB tournaments making scheduling very difficult. The ALA is working with he ALRA to cap those numbers.
 - vi. They are testing a “At Risk Pay” program at the Junior A Division. Bonus for the Crew Chief who make no mistakes.
- d. Coach Referee Evaluation Form will be an app in 2026
- e. UBER and Super Coaching Clinics: APRIL 10-12, 2026
 - i. UBER Clinic is by invitation only for Level 3 and up Referees.
 - ii. Super Clinic Comp Intro Course: Anyone can attend the Comp Intro Super Clinic who has a minimum Community Development completed. It is held in Okotoks because it is super cheap and includes the hotel, 5 meals, clinic, and networking for a reasonable fee. Returning Comp Intro Coaches will earn PD points.
- f. Division Statistics – Provincial roster, ref evals, penalty minutes, bench stats, and ages.
- g. Game Sheets and Statistics
 - i. RMLL is moving to entirely web-based stats for 2026. LiveGameSheets is the app. It is easy to use. The games can pre-downloaded to an iPad in case your facility has poor Wi-Fi. Experience tells us that a paper game sheet is also VERY important as a counterbalance. They easily done at the same time. For 2026, every SrC team will do the paper and make a concerted effort to use the app.
 - ii. Misconduct vs Game vs Gross – please make sure your Game Sheet writer knows the difference. If you realize they made a mistake, correct in computer stats, and leave Amanda a note when submitting.
 - iii. Remember to hit COMPLETE to finish the Game.
 - iv. The Goalie stats were very wrong this year because not everyone was entering which goalie played.
 - v. How to submit a game sheet – when scanned or photographed – large and clear
 - vi. Please do not lose the game sheet.

- h. Website
 - i. Revamp is coming: The website is going mobile friendly.
 - ii. Players Photos: The old photos are still in the system, but the link is broken, so you have to re-upload.
 - iii. Coaches Photos: They will be required on new website. An actual photo not a team logo.
- i. Discipline Committee Representatives for 2026 – Shayne Moon and Kris Melhus
- j. Supplemental Discipline – There is a new set of Regulations coming regarding the submission of video for supplemental discipline. It will involve fast timelines and a fee.
- k. Regulation Changes and Review
 - i. ALA:
 - RAMP Enhancements: Will now include Gender Identification
 - Apparently, Lacrosse Canada has changed their rates so that may affect Trainers, Managers, Coaches and Players Intent to Play fees.
 - Coaches who are Players as well, will not be billed as they are already covered by their Intent to Play.
 - Regulation 12C was significantly revised to provide a clearer description of when conduct in and around the watching of ALA games empowering members to ensure spectators and parents are behaving appropriately.
 - The tournaments link is not about Major. If you decide to hold a tournament, do not use that link, contact your Division Commissioner.
 - ii. RMLL Regulations with a SrC focus
 - 13.3 – No run time in playoffs
 - 13.6 Media Breaks are to be as near to the 10-minute mark as possible but after a whistle but not after a goal
 - 31.5.1.1 Call-Up Requests require a reason for the request
 - 31.10.2.1 Senior B players released to SrC can be called up to SrB Provincials if they have four (4) games between the two divisions. This does not go the other direction. Senior B players who get traded to a SrC team can not use their SrB games to qualify for SrC Provincials.
 - 42.15. Any player/goalkeeper who receives one hundred (100) cumulative penalty minutes in one (1) Regular Season will receive a two (2) game suspension. This will remain the same. Coaches will be notified when a player is approaching fifty (50).
 - 42.3 Any player, goalkeeper or non-playing personnel receiving a match penalty will be assessed a minimum three (3) game suspension and a one-hundred-dollar (\$100.00) fine, unless the player, goalkeeper or non-playing personnel is registered to a team in a league with 12 or less Regular Season games and then the player will be assessed a minimum two (2) game suspension and a one hundred dollar (\$100.00) fine. This was discussed at length during the Executive Planning Meeting, and the Executive have tasked the Commissioners to use more discretion and flexibility.
 - 40.3 All suspensions have a clause about not being involved in team operations before and after a game for 30 minutes, but players can watch inconspicuously from the stands. Please ensure that this happens.

1. General Information and Deadlines

- i. Only the Edmonton Warriors, Edmonton Miners, Parkland Posse and the Lakeland Heat are covered by the larger program's Body Corporate, everyone else needs to submit Alberta Society paperwork as soon as their financial year is done. On the RMLL Website under the Admin Team is Body Corporate 101 with instructions and sample forms. File your Annual Return with the Alberta Government and send Proof of Filing to Executive Director.
- ii. Transfers in from out of province who have played in the last five years need to complete a LC Transfer. They transfer FROM their old to the new team. They find their OLD team in the system and request a transfer to new team. It is a two-part process. Players more than 5 years out need an email from their old province. The player or the team can request one from me. I will follow up the chain of communication.
- iii. Team Constraints must be entered by January 15, 2026.
- iv. Facility Specifications need to be resubmitted by April 1, 2026.
- v. ALA AGM is November 21-23, 2025, in Canmore. Remember to have your Head Coach proxy their vote to an attendee, if they are not attending.
- vi. Please put the team practices and off-season programming into the Team Events for insurance reasons.
- vii. All upper body goalie gear must be covered by the jersey. There is to be no rolling up or flaring up the jersey sleeves.
- viii. Please ask your fans to behave in the stands. No one should ever be invited to watch the game from outside the arena. It is your Franchises responsibility to manage the crowd.
- ix. Trade deadline is currently 11:59 PM of the last day of gameplay of the regular season. Trade Deadline: Motion: To move the trade deadline to 2 weeks prior to the end of regular season play. Everson/Jobb, Carried
- x. EAP and Franchise Certificate – when these EAPs are due please submit new names to Melinda and she will compile for the division. When you complete your Franchise Certificate, please double check everyone's contact info is correct.
- xi. Be nice to each other on the social media.

Senior C Division 2025 Season in Review

The 2025 season was defined by significant growth in both teams and players, culminating in a dramatic Provincial championship weekend.

Growth and Recruitment

- **Division Expansion:** The division grew to 11 teams with the addition of the Parkland Posse and Lakeland Heat. The Blackfalds Silverbacks moved to the South Division to decrease their travel time.
- **Player Numbers:** Total player registration increased by 25% to 356 players, up from 284 in the previous season. Team rosters ranged from 24 to 40 players.
- **Junior Integration:** The league successfully integrated 29 graduating Junior players, demonstrating a strong pipeline for future talent.
- **Demographics:** The player age range was remarkably wide, from 18 to 65, with an average age of 30.

Season Highlights and Accomplishments

- **Regular Season:** The North Division, Edmonton Warriors, Edmonton Miners, Lakeland Heat, Border Rage and Parkland Posse, played each other a balanced three times with 6 home and 6 away. The South Division, Blackfalds Silverbacks, Mount View Stingers, Airdrie Mohawks, Calgary Bears, Calgary Irish and Lethbridge Pioneers, played unbalanced 12 games but maintaining the 6 home and 6 away.
 - The Edmonton Warriors dominated the regular season, finishing with a record of 11 wins and a tie.
- **Provincials:** Hosted flawlessly by the Blackfalds Silverbacks, the championship weekend was a major success.
 - The round-robin stage ended in a three-way tie between the Edmonton Warriors, Airdrie Mohawks, and Calgary Bears, requiring a mathematical tiebreaker to determine the finalists. As an aside, the Edmonton Miners made a good showing for their first entry to Provincials.
 - The Airdrie Mohawks, the South Champions, defeated the Edmonton Warriors, the North Champions, in the final to retain the Provincial Trophy.
- **Trades:** A flurry of last-minute trades was handled responsibly, primarily used to replace injured players rather than stacking playoff rosters.

Challenges and Setbacks

- **Player Safety:** There was a concerning number of anecdotal reports of injuries that impacted players' ability to attend work.
- **Referee Costs:** The high cost associated with referee travel remains a significant financial burden for our rural teams.
- **Logistics:** The Crossover Weekend was cancelled due to an inability to secure a suitable venue.
- **Discipline:** High intensity during games occasionally led to challenges with player conduct in penalty box areas and on the floor. However, this season did have the least number of suspension letters written.
- **Travel:** There was a marked decrease in benches when the teams had to travel. Only twice did a home team record 15 or under players, but it happened 13 times to an away team.

Future Outlook

The league will continue to focus on sustainable growth by supporting teams and recruiting new players. Key priorities for the future include improving player safety, managing operational costs, and fostering a strong culture of sportsmanship.

RMLL Coaching Program Requirements

First year RMLL coach must be Community Development Trained

- Trained - Attended a clinic
- Completed Making Head Way in the Locker
- Complete the Safe Sport Module in the Locker

Second year RMLL coach must be Competitive Introduction Trained

- Trained - Attended a clinic
- Completed Making Ethical Decisions Online Clinic for Comp Intro Complete Making Head Way (MHW) in Sport in the Locker by December of the year attended the clinic
- Complete the Safe Sport Module in the Locker

RMLL coach must Competitive Introduction Certified to go on the Bench at Presidents' Minto and Founders' or to go out-of-province.

- Certified Complete In-Person Evaluation
- Complete Making Ethical Decisions (MED) Evaluation (test) in the Locker
- Professional Development (PD) Points

Once a coach is Comp Intro Certified, the coach must acquire 20 PD Points every 5 years to maintain their certification status. A Competitive Development Certified coach must acquire 30 PD points every 5 years to maintain their certification status.

6. Loss of Certification

If a coach does not acquire their required PD points in the 5-year span, they lose their certification status and must acquire the missing PD points to become certified again. A coach with missing PD points will not be allowed to go on the Bench for Presidents', Minto or Founders'.

7. Female Only Teams

Each Junior and Senior Major Female Franchise must have one female coach registered as Bench Personnel on their Franchise Certificate.

2025 RMLL RIC Report

As we look to the 2026 season and the increased interest in expansion across all divisions, the largest issue the RMLL will experience is scheduling games with the floor available so appropriate referees can be assigned. Unfortunately, if all team applications are accepted, weekday games will become required, which will mean teams losing practice time, or finding additional floors in order to have appropriate officials assigned for the best interests of the players and coaches. An alternative solution would be to reduce the number of games each team plays in each division.

Season Accomplishments

The feedback across the RMLL is largely that the RMLL continues to maintain an overall high level of officiating competency, with the exception of the Jr B Tier I level. This was highlighted at the national level by RMLL officials refereeing on-floor at the national levels, both minor and major. Rule application and situations have largely been consistent, with the exception of the Founders Cup, where rules were unclear and unset until competition was set to begin. Another Central Alberta official from the RMLL was hired to the NLL.

Season Overview

We have continued to recover officials who elected to take time off over the past few seasons, and promoted many others into the RMLL, or new divisions within it. Three officials have been tasked with contacting RMLL officials who have not re-registered in the past few years, as well as graduating RMLL and minor players who are not registering to play in 2026. The implementation of the 3-official mechanic to Tier II, in addition at the leagues with National Championships (Jr A, Tier I, and Sr B), was another large success for safety and game flow, however, 38 fewer games were covered by the 3-official system in 2025 compared to 2024. All major national championships

continued to use the 3-officials system, with only Founders not using modified rules identical or nearly identical to the RMLL rules. Having another official on the floor to de-escalate scenarios behind the play, or assess infractions, or even staying low when teams spread the floor, still allows for two officials to move up with the play and maintain adequate sightlines/coverage. Additionally, when fights/scrums/altercation occur, two officials are able to defuse the situation, while the third is able to control the benches and record additional infractions away from the scrum, or that the officials breaking up the situation may not be able to see. Using hockey as an analogous sport (and controlling for cost in the comparison), the comparable leagues to the RMLL have nearly all moved to four-official (WHL, USport, ACAC, Jr A, Sr AAA, Jr B, Sr AA), and did not adjust their fees downwards. Included is a link to compare, but the difference between a University Men's game and Sr B is over \$100/referee, and \$5/linesperson). This is due to the increased speed and rules that emphasis speed and skill. It is not unreasonable to have the third official standard in our leagues with National Championships and then cascade down, as more officials become available.

Season Setbacks

As in previous years, the basing of Lloydminster in Hillmond, Sk and overlapping home game start times, particularly in the North East region of our province, made home games were difficult to schedule referees. Centres in these areas must assist us in recruiting ex-players or officials from a different sport in order to reduce travel costs and ensure these games are able to be played as scheduled. Hopefully, the officials slated to contact the aforementioned players not registering in 2026 are able to find officials in this specific area. A change in assigning practices was required, and executed in 2025. Jack Sylven was able to assign all regular season games as scheduled and I assisted with confirming officials for playoffs and provincials. Our 2026 goal will be to have all leagues who have requested 3-official have 3 officials assigned. I will be closely monitoring and assisting Jack in the regular season assignments to meet this goal.

Growth and Recruitment

With the success of LC utilizing the 3-official system and moving towards it for major national championships, the RMLL would best support the continued excellence of officials at national championships by using the 3-official system for all playoffs and provincials. This will continue to require more officials be moved into the RMLL and be available during July & August. Officials consistently gaining in-game experience in different levels and settings has returned to historic levels. Minor assigning of appropriate up-and-coming officials where they gain experience in real game situations is still crucial to promoting more officials to the RMLL, especially as more officials are retiring and others are requesting to limit the amount of games they work in a week.

Existing officials also have improved over the course of the last few season. With the assigning responsibilities delegated elsewhere, I can continue to work on solidifying the playing rules for the RMLL and work with the WLA on creating a pathway for officials to work 2-3 weekends in Sr A this summer, and work to move more of our officials into the Sr A circuit. Looking to the Future/Upcoming Season Goals

Staffing 100% of all regular season games in the leagues with national championships, and 100% of playoffs/provincials with the 3-officials system is one goal. We need to additional about 20 new officials to officiating staff, with 5 of those being in Wheatland and 5 of those in the Edmonton area, 5 in Central Alberta, and 5 in Calgary.

Thank you to everyone for their support in making the 2025 season an enjoyable experience.

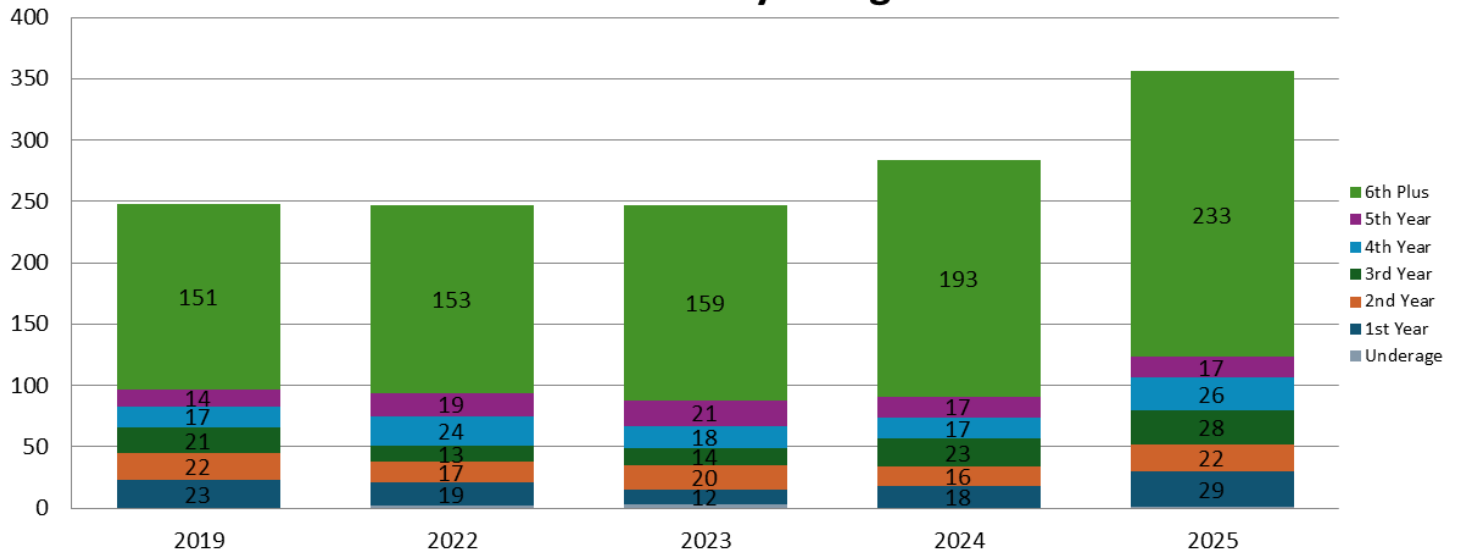
